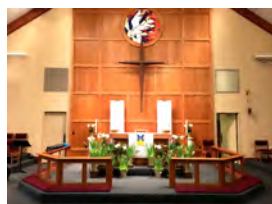
2019 SOUTHERN SYNOD OHIO ASSEMBLY

A Mother's Day Prayer For You - Anonymous

I said a Mother's Day prayer for you to thank the Lord above for blessing me with a lifetime of your tenderhearted love. I thanked God for the caring you've shown me through the years, for the closeness we've enjoyed in time of laughter and of tears. And so, I thank you from the heart for all you've done for me and I bless the Lord for giving me the best mother there could be!



WORDS FROM PR. CHRISTIE

"Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."

- Luke 23:34



I think about Jesus, in this moment, looking down from the cross. Here are soldiers who beat him and nailed him up there. Now they are taunting him. His response: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

I don't feel like I have the strength to do that – to look at those who have committed great injustices and to forgive them – but we serve a God who does have that strength. Even more than that, our God gives us everything we need (Romans 8:32). If we need the strength to forgive someone, all we have to do is ask.

Once, there was a person with whom I was extremely angry. I felt that this person had done something terrible to me and I was finding it quite impossible to forgive him. Honestly, "Why should I?" I thought. I believed that my anger was justified, that it was keeping me strong. In reality, our lack of forgiveness does not give us strength; it can be a crippling weakness over time. The burden can weigh us down, cloud our judgement, and hurt us way more than it is hurting the other person.

I began to pray for a way to forgive, and God answers prayer.

One day, I ended up seated next to the person in a worship service. This was not my choice; I'm convinced that God made the seating chart that day. At the end of the service, we were asked to join hands and pray the Lord's Prayer. And so, I took the hand of my enemy and prayed "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." I found it impossible to hold onto my anger while praying this prayer and holding the hand of someone I needed to forgive.

Suddenly, as I prayed, forgiveness happened. I could feel it wash over me. My anger was gone. Like the stories of Jesus dispelling demons, my anger just went away. Something must have happened for the other person during that prayer as well, because after the service, he asked for my forgiveness. I replied: "already done."

These opportunities don't come every day. If you get one, TAKE IT. In the meantime, if there is someone that God is laying it on your heart to forgive, here is a 3-step prayer and meditation practice that I have found helpful:

- 1) Pray for forgiveness. We all have hurt others, even unintentionally. In this first step, think of someone you have hurt, visualize yourself asking the person's forgiveness, and pray for God to forgive you.
- 2) Ask God to help you forgive yourself. God forgives us, but we often neglect to forgive ourselves. Acknowledge God's grace, God's forgiveness, and allow this to encompass you. We must forgive ourselves in order to move forward in healthy relationships.
- 3) Ask God to forgive the other person and to help you forgive the other person. Perhaps envision praying the Lord's Prayer while holding that person's hand. Ask for God's strength to help you let go of your anger, sadness, grief, pain...anything you're holding on to that you want to let get of.

And a final word about forgiveness: it is not weakness; it is great strength. Forgiving a person does not mean that you continue in a relationship that is harmful. Forgiveness is the ability to let go and move forward, in mutual love, on both sides of the relationship.

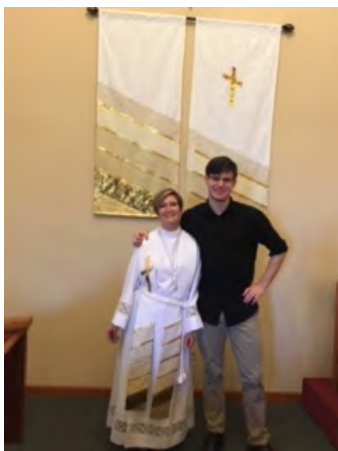

SEEKING SUNDAY NURSERY ATTENDANT

Hours 8:45-12:15 every Sunday
Pay \$15.00 per hour paid monthly

Duties as follows...

1. Ability to pass a criminal background check, including reports of child abuse/neglect.
2. Be polite, friendly, and courteous to all children, parents, and volunteers.
3. Straighten the room before leaving.
4. Experience in caring for children between the ages of 0 to 5 with the ability to adapt and interact with a variety of personalities.
 - At least 18 years of age
 - Satisfactory completion of background and child abuse/neglect check
 - Satisfactory completion of CPR/First Aid training for infants and children highly recommended
 - Two references
5. Ensure that all children are properly checked in by a parent or caregiver and are subsequently checked out by the parent or caregiver designated at check-in.
6. Provide a loving and accepting environment for all children and their families.
7. Supervise play.
8. Attendance- Regular attendance is essential for satisfactory performance in this position.
9. Available Sunday mornings, including holidays.
10. Positive attitude and a joy for working with infants and young children.
11. The Nursery Worker(s) would be responsible for overseeing the nursery and caring for the children who show up on Sunday mornings during worship, including holidays.
12. Nursery Worker will be responsible for coordinating sick days, vacation and time off, either with the Worship Chair, Mike Schweinfest or with the Pastor.
13. Communicate effectively and positively with children, coworkers, parents, and visitors.

Treat Mom with this yummy, beautiful yogurt parfait.

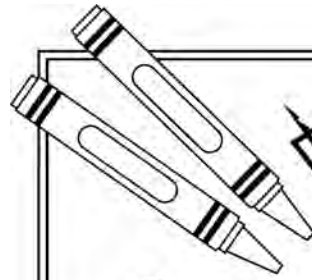


What you need:
