WORDS FROM PR. CHRISTIE

To tie in with our Thursday afternoon Bible study, I am writing a series of articles on the Psalms. Each month, I highlight a different Psalm. I invite you to read the Psalm and then use this article to reflect upon it during your devotional time.



This month I highlight Psalm 61:

Imagine, if you will, the Psalmist, who is feeling so far from God, that she is at the opposite ends of the earth from God, perhaps even in a great chasm. Hear my cry, O God, she calls out, in desperation, feeling of faint heart, and asking God to lead her to the rock that is higher than she is. Maybe the psalmist envisions herself in a great valley, surrounded on all sides by cliffs that she cannot climb, and is asking God to lead her just to one rock that is a little bit higher than the one she is on, so that she can climb a little bit higher, and then a little higher, and a little higher still, to get closer to God, to get out of the depths of despair, to get away from the trouble that pursues her.

- Or maybe the psalmist is a soldier. The end of the earth is the border of the land. This is a prayer before battle. God is the soldier's refuge as he prepares for battle. He cries for God's protection, for the protection of the one who is his strong tower against enemies. The soldier asks for God to watch over the king, the ruler who leads them into battle.
- Or perhaps the psalmist is one of the Israelites who were taken from their home into exile in Babylon, so when she cries to God from the opposite end of the earth, she is far from her home, far from her family, her friends, the temple where she used to worship God. Everything is unfamiliar and terrifying.
- Or the psalmist could be in failing health, with the end of the earth being the borderline between this world and the next.

Regardless of the situation, the psalmist cries to God and is certain that God will answer his prayer, and he will praise God.

In this short psalm, the writer goes from expressing distress, to proclaiming assurance of God's strength and resting in God's protection, to asking for

additional protection for the king, and finally, to singing praise to God's name, day after day.

How does he get there? – the psalmist – in 8 verses – to being so sure that God is giving him a positive answer and he is going to sing God's praises forever?

How do we get there? How do we know, how can we be certain, how can we have faith, how can we trust that God is going to be with us, see us through that canyon, over that mountain, across this gulf that seems to separate us even from God himself? Can we trust that God will be with us through the illness that we are facing, through the relationship or family difficulties we are having? Can we see God on the other end of the earth when we are far from home and missing the people who love us most?

As you reflect on this psalm in your devotional time, I invite you to think about all of the times when your prayers have been answered. Though at times we may feel far away from these blessings, we are truly blessed by our God, who answers prayer to the extent that – even though we start out in the depths of the chasm, we know we can move on to shelter and comfort by verse 4 and to thanksgiving by verse 8. I believe in this God who shields and guards us like a fortress tower, a God who loves us so much as to protect us with the fierceness of a mother eagle or an angel with the body of a lion. And I believe this God is sheltering you.

In conclusion I echo the words of the psalmist. May you find peace and comfort in these verses:

Lead me to the rock
that is higher than I;
³ for you are my refuge,
a strong tower against the enemy.
⁴ Let me abide in your tent forever,
find refuge under the shelter of your wings.

JOIN IN HOPE'S RECYCLING

Our Narthex area counter bins house donations for several different organizations:



- **Matthew 25** collects used clean pill bottles with and without labels for undeveloped countries for their use.
- **Love Packages** accepts new and used religious materials such as Bibles, devotional materials, religious brochures, books, etc. that are sent internationally.
- **Lions Club via LensCrafters** distributes used glasses to others in need.
- **SON Ministry** collects food and personal care items for the community members that are unable to provide for themselves.
- **Ronald McDonald House** collects tabs to help support their mission to help provide housing for families of children treated at Children's Hospital.
- **Plastic Bottle Caps** for Hope's youth to have a Buddy Bench made for our church. (Check the counter for a list of caps accepted.)
- **Dental Hygiene Clinic at UC Blue Ash** collects used manual toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes and caps, outer packaging for brushes and paste, and empty dental floss containers.
- **Box Tops for Education** provides playground equipment to area schools.
- **First Lutheran Clothing Room** collects clothing, shoes, and personal care items for the Over-the-Rhine area downtown.

Contributing these items is good stewardship, and the organizations are very thankful for our participation.



PATRIOTIC PINWHEEL

Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5" x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw



What you do:

1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!
