It is Well

Our theme for Lent this year is “It is Well With my Soul,” based on the lyrics of the hymn by this same title:

*When peace, like a river, attendeth my way,
When sorrows like sea billows roll;
Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say,
It is well, it is well with my soul.*

While the lyrics themselves definitely speak to us as we journey through Lenten wilderness, the story behind the lyrics is even more captivating.

The author was Horatio Spafford, a successful Chicago businessman. In 1871, Spafford’s son died of scarlet fever, and Spafford lost his fortune after the great Chicago Fire. Two years later, his wife and four daughters set out on a ship for a trip to Europe. Spafford expected to join them shortly, but their ship sank en route. Several days later, Spafford received a cable from his wife, which read “Saved alone.”



It was in the wake of these terribly tragedies that Spafford wrote the words to “It is Well With my Soul.”

Lent is a time when we walk through the wilderness with Jesus. Some of us may be giving things up for Lent, and some of us may have had things or people taken from us before we were ready to give them up. Either way, I invite you to explore the words of this hymn and reflect on Horatio Spafford’s story. No matter what happened, he had faith that all was well and in God’s hands. Can we say the same?

THE SEASON OF LENT

Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days. All churches that have a continuous history extending before AD 1500 observe Lent. The ancient church that wrote, collected, canonized, and propagated the New Testament also observed Lent, believing it to be a commandment from the apostles. Hope's Prayer Chain is a busy and wonderful source for comforting prayers or praise prayers in sadness or tragedy as well as happy events.



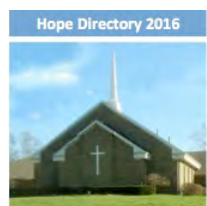

ATTENTION PARENTS & GUARDIANS:

We are delighted that our nursery is being utilized by our amazing Hope families, and Linda is doing a great job caring for our little ones! To keep all of our children safe and assist Linda Carter in doing her job, please note the following nursery guidelines:

- 1) To remain compliant with fire code and staff/child ratio requirements, please limit nursery use to children 4 and under, and no more than 5 children in nursery at a time.
- 2) Please complete a registration sheet for each child in the nursery, so that Linda has information about your child and contact information for you.
- 3) Please go to the nursery to sign your child in and out each week. If you authorize an older sibling or other adult to pick up your child, note this on your registration form. Children will only be allowed to leave the nursery with a person listed on their form.



We will soon have windows installed in all the doors to be in compliance with our Child Protection policy and our church insurance. Thank you so much for your help in ensuring the safety of our nursery and our children!

JOIN IN HOPE'S RECYCLING

Our Narthex area counter bins house donations for several different organizations:

- **Matthew 25** collects used clean pill bottles with and without labels for undeveloped countries for their use.

- **Love Packages** accepts new and used religious materials such as Bibles, devotional materials, religious brochures, books, etc. that are sent internationally.

- **Lions Club via LensCrafters** distributes used glasses to others in need.



- **SON Ministry** collects food and personal care items for the community members that are unable to provide for themselves.

- **Ronald McDonald House** collects tabs to help support their mission to help provide housing for families of children treated at Children's Hospital.

- **Plastic Bottle Caps** for EarthConnection, an environmental group.

- **Dental Hygiene Clinic at UC Blue Ash** collects used manual toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes and caps, outer packaging for brushes and paste, and empty dental floss containers.

- **Box Tops for Education** provides playground equipment to area schools.

- **First Lutheran Clothing Room** collects clothing, shoes, boots, towels, wash clothes, and personal care items for the Over-the-Rhine area downtown.

Joyful noise



Use your voice and this hand-crafted percussion instrument to make joyful noises to the Lord.

What you need:

- Dry beans (about one Tbsp)
- Plastic Easter egg
- 2 plastic spoons
- Masking tape
- Markers and stickers

What you do:

1. Place the beans inside the egg and snap it closed.
2. Set the egg in a spoon and cover it with the second spoon so the spoons are holding the egg.
3. Tape the spoons to the egg. Also wrap tape around the spoons from top to bottom to make a shaker handle.
4. Decorate your shaker and use it as you sing praises to God.
5. Experiment with sounds by filling other eggs with coins, rice, and so on.
