PASTOR CHRISTIE'S CORNER

An Attitude of Gratitude

#AbundantlyBlessed

Over the past year, we have been exploring the theme of "Abundance." When we approach life with a mentality of abundance, it means starting the conversation with what we are blessed to have, rather than what we are frustrated not to have. It is a "glass half full" mentality. We focus on our blessings and on our stories of faith and gratitude, trusting that God will provide anything we need.



Last summer, I wrote a series of 7 devotionals on the theme of Abundance for our 2021 Synod Assembly. I have shared six of these with you throughout these past several months, and now I share the 7th and final devotional:

Day 7 – Receiving

Romans 8:31-32 *If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else?*

Reflect: How often do we assume that our prayers are petty, or not worthy of God's attention? How often do we need or desire something and assume we can procure that ourselves, without asking God for it? How often do we assume that something is out of reach, without even praying about it? Asking for and receiving help can be humbling. It means admitting that we cannot do everything on our own. And this is exactly what God wants us to know – that we cannot do everything on our own. If we are aware of a great need – whether in our families or faith communities or somewhere else, why not ask God for it? In order to live into an abundant life, we must be willing to ask for and receive God's gifts.

Prayer and Meditation: After you've settled, breathed, and connected with God today, think of one or more blessings that seems out of reach, perhaps for your faith community. Maybe this is something that has been worrying you for a while. Ask God to guide you and your faith community to

the resources that you need, and to guide your own steps in leading your community into this endeavor. Pray: God of abundant blessings, show me how to better trust that you will provide all things. Show me how to ask and to receive blessings, especially when that feels like a difficult thing to do. Humble me as a leader in my faith community, that I may point toward you at all times. Guide my faith community toward unexpected, grace-filled, and Spirit-led paths of abundant life. **Amen.**

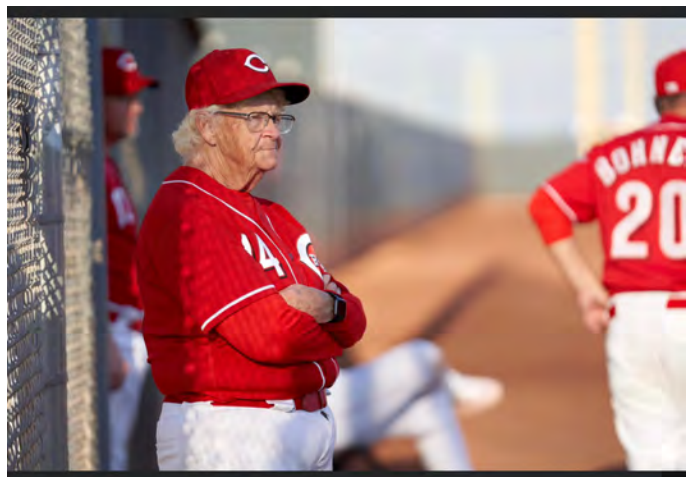
NURSERY IS OPEN

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

February 2022 by Zoom

- ◆Chris Arany, Treasurer: **See his report above.**
- ◆Mike Schweinfest, Worship: Council voted to have the January 16th worship service back in-person with wearing masks strongly encouraged and social distancing. Worship procedures will be re-evaluated weekly.
- ◆The church building will be thoroughly cleaned prior to worship on January 16.
- ◆Wednesday Lenten services will be virtual. Maundy Thursday is scheduled for 7 pm on March 14th at Hope. Easter will have 2 services - 9am and 11 am with a breakfast and Easter Egg Hunt between services.
- ◆K.C. Kless, Evangelism: Book Club is finishing the book "Fierce."
- ◆He is teaching Yoga 2 days each month.



◆On March 27th, Hope will provide a meal on March 27th at UC Edge House,

◆We will begin collecting clothing for the Franciscan Sisters of the Poor. In addition to clothing, they will accept bread clips/tags, empty foil coffee bags, used gift/membership cards, CD/DVDs and cassette tapes.

◆He is looking into a virtual run/walk for Save the Bees.

◆Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship: The table worship on 12/26 went well. She thanked **Butch Royse, Chuck Hasdorff, and Ron Thatcher** for helping her committee to set up for the event.

◆Jerry Ivins, Digital Ministry: The goal is to have everyone attending worship complete a media release form.

◆Pastor Christie: She met with the Colerain Chamber of Commerce. The council voted to spend \$100 to join the organization.

◆The council voted to purchase doors locks for 2 classrooms and the nursery. **Chuck Hasdorff** will install them.

◆Council installation will be at January 30th service.

◆Jen Byrne, President: The agenda for the Congregational Meeting on January 23rd was set including the treasurer's and committee reports as well as voting in the new council members.

◆The 2021 Audit Committee still needs one member.

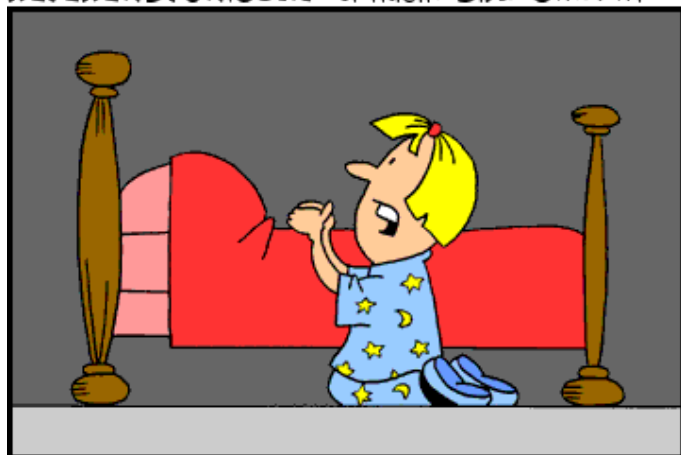
◆The Congregational Vitality Team is working on community listening.
