



PASTOR CHRISTIE'S CORNER Sheltering In Place

Remember two years ago, when we were asked to "shelter in place" at the beginning of the COVID pandemic? This was the first time I had paid attention to the words, "shelter in place,"



perhaps because my previous instances of sheltering in place had been brief. Turns out "shelter in place" orders can be given for a variety of reasons: severe weather, natural disasters, active shooter situations, chemical spills, and apparently pandemics.

Any situation where we are asked to shelter in place can be a cause of fear and anxiety for us. Long-term sheltering situations cause feelings of isolation and result in lack of access to needed supplies and information.

Many of us are still feeling off-balance from the changes in our lives over these past couple of years. Perhaps fear, anxiety, isolation, depression, and new challenges are still creeping into our lives each day.

This is why I chose the theme "shelter" for Lent this year. This theme abounds throughout the Bible, especially the Psalms – this idea of relying upon God as our shelter and our refuge.

The first psalm we will read together as part of this series is Psalm 91. I love this Psalm because one of my favorite hymns – "On Eagles' Wings" – is based on Psalm 91. Also, the sheltering language and imagery is powerful and beautiful:

You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust." (v. 1-2)

What does it mean to "live in the shelter" of God? Perhaps it is like spiritually sheltering in place. As the worries of life surround us, we find shelter in God. Sheltering in God is unlike hiding in the basement during an active shooter threat – worrying that any moment something terrible will happen.

Perhaps sheltering in God is more like staying home in front of your fireplace on a snowy day. You are warm and safe as you watch the beautiful snowflakes swirl in front of your window. You have heat, food, comfort, and hopefully the companionship of family and/or your pet. You are sheltering in place, but you are cozy and happy. As the Psalmist promises:


You will not fear the terror of the night, or the arrow that flies by day, or the pestilence that stalks in darkness, or the destruction that wastes at noonday. (v. 5-6)

This is what sheltering in God is all about. Allowing our fears and worries to dissipate, trusting that God will take care of us and of the world, knowing that even though threats and worries abound, we are safe "under [God's] wings" (v. 4). It's a comforting image – to think of God having wings large enough to shelter all of us like little eaglets. In God, we are sustained, fed, loved, comforted, and protected from all harm. May you find this comfort and shelter in God, today and always.



- ♦ Chris Arany, Treasurer: See his report above for
- ♦ Mike Schweinfest, Worship: The safety plan for those attending worship is to continue with masks being optional. The communion rails will be replaced on Maundy Thursday for communion at Easter services. Wednesday Lenten services will be at Hope.
- **♦Erica Leppert, Christian Education:** Sunday school is held during part of the worship services. Plans are in the works for Lenten services.
- **★K.C. Kless, Evangelism:** Book Club is on hold until December. Community Yoga is 2 days each month. NOSH at Edge House is on March 27th. Sign-up sheets will be out shortly. A couple of people have signed up for "Save The Bees."

- ◆Bonnie Long, Generosity: Her committee consists of Karen Schneider, Ron Long, Alita Simpson, and Jerry Ivins. The committee is working on helping the children understand Stewardship and why we donate our time, talent and money.
- **♦Chuck Hasdorff, Property:** He replaced the locks on the doors by the daycare, took down the visiting parking signs and changed the key codes.
- **◆Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship:** There will be a Continental Easter Breakfast between services and an Easter egg Hunt. She and Erica are working on a Palm Sunday plan for the children.
- **♦Pastor Christie:** Wednesday services will be at Hope and a Good Friday Cantata at Groesbeck UMC. The ELCA annual report is nearly finished. Weddings at Hope will be limited for an undetermined time. There will be a Youth Gathering in Cincinnati this July.
- **♦Jen Byrne, President:** The insurance rates are locked in for three years. An insurance review was discussed. The Collaborative has been postponed. The ELCA has requested we increase our giving by \$500 to \$8500. With the budget set, we will explore change for next year.
- ◆The contract for Yellow Brick Road will be reviewed.


I'VE GOT STELLAR REFLEXES ... THAT'S ANOTHER POSITIVE TRAIT!



- 1 package unflavored gelatin
- ³/₄ cup very warm water
- 1 tsp salt
- ¾ cup gel body wash
- Food coloring
- Rubbing alcohol in spray bottle
- · Silicone baking molds

What you do:

- In a bowl, stir gelatin and warm water until dissolved.
- Add salt, body wash and a few drops of food coloring. Stir.
- Spray molds with rubbing alcohol (to prevent bubbles).
 Place molds on a tray.
- Pour mixture into the molds. Refrigerate until set, about two hours.
- 5. Pop soap out of molds and store in an airtight container.
