PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

The Transformation of Holy Communion

When you take communion, have you ever thought about all the processes of transformation that occurred in order for us to partake together in the sacrament of bread and wine that is the body and blood of Christ?



As our Bible Study group wraps up our study of **Scouting the Divine**, we find ourselves learning about wine. There are hundreds of images in the Bible about grapes, vines, vineyards, wine, and winemaking. Many of the original hearers of scripture would have understood these images as a part of their everyday lives in ways that many of us may not be able to relate to, and so understanding more about vineyards is helpful to our own study of scripture.

One passage that we examined is when Jesus turns water into wine in John 2:1-11. In a matter of moments, Jesus transforms multiple large jars of water into the finest of wines. This might not seem like an important miracle, but we've learned some things in our Bible study about wine that enlighten this passage. First of all, it takes years to make wine - approximately 8 years from first vine to first bottle. Additionally, making fine wine is an expensive and time-consuming endeavor. The finest wines are incredibly expensive to produce, in part because a vine with fewer grapes on it will produce grapes with more intense flavor; quality is valued over quantity in the making of fine wine. It is truly a miracle that Jesus can transform something as simple as water into something as complex into wine so quickly.



As we come to the table of Holy Communion, we might never have thought before about all the time, effort, and transformation it took to place the bread and wine before us. And here at the table, we experience the most miraculous transformation of all: In the presence of Holy Spirit, these not-so-simple gifts of bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ. Bread and wine become Christ in our midst, food with the power to transform our very lives.

Each time we partake of the sacrament of Holy Communion, we emerge forever changed. Transformed. From a single grape seed and a single grain of wheat into holy, nourishing, and transforming food for life - both as individuals and as a community. This is truly a miracle.

During your devotional time this month, and the next time you have the opportunity to partake of Holy Communion, I invite you to think about a few things: Where and when in your life have you experienced transformation? Are there places in life now where you are longing for transformation? If so, invite Christ to be present in those places, to transform the ordinary into the extraordinary. When we allow ourselves to be transformed in this way, we experience God's miraculous abundance in ways we never could have anticipated.

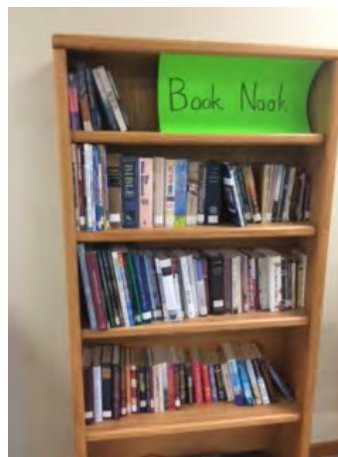


family and can feel the prayers and love that we send their way everyday! Once again, our Hope family transformed into the caring hands of God! God is so good!

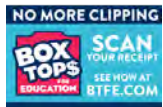

◆**Jen Byrne, President:** The council was assigned to work on a Hope Purpose Statement.

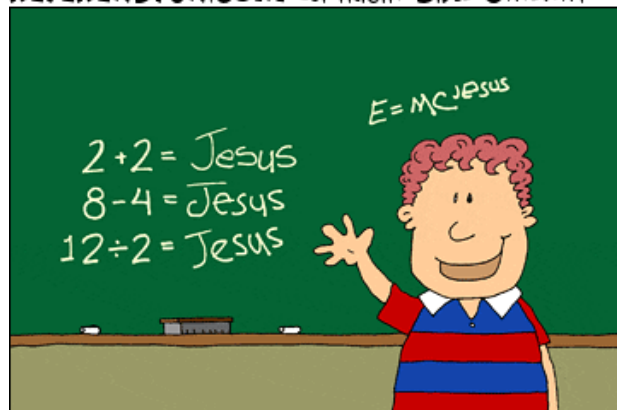
◆Constitutional changes will be voted on at the August 28th Congregational Meeting following the 10 am service.
