The Generosity Team is excited to announce a new opportunity for our congregation: The Generosity Project. The Generosity Project is an expression of the



ELCA churchwide initiative to grow faithful stewards and generous leaders, so all may grow in their capacity to recognize and respond to God's abundant grace and generosity – in congregations and at home. The goals of the project are to connect people ages 2 to 102, equip all ages and households for

the faith practice of generosity, and to grow in God's grace generation to generation. Hope's Generosity Team looks forward to bringing this initiative to Hope beginning October 2nd.

The Generosity Project will be presented in 6 sessions, and the committee will offer an in-person option and a virtual option.

#### PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink,[a] or about your body, what you will wear." –

Matthew 6:25



Two of the most common phrases in the Bible are "do not be afraid," and "do not worry." It seems that God, Jesus, angels, and many other Biblical characters were often trying to calm everyone, to alleviate fears and worries. This is not terribly surprising, given that the original hearers of this word were humans just like us. I imagine that if we all listened for the voice of God in our lives right now at this very moment, one of the things God would say to us is "Do not worry," or "Do not be afraid."

Our fears and worries might include questions such as: How can I survive this illness? How can I survive through the grief and pain I am experiencing? How can I best care for my loved ones? Do I have enough time, enough money, enough patience, knowledge, energy, or physical well-being to get through my current season of life?

I am sure you have many other questions,



concerns, worries, anxieties, and fears during this time that you are experiencing in life right now. I know I have experienced all of these and more.

When I am in a moment (or week or month or year) of anxiety, one of

the phrases I try to tell myself is: "This too shall pass." I encourage myself to breathe. And to "just be." Sometimes by looking around at the changing of the seasons, at nature, at the abundant gifts and blessings God has given us, we can reset our mindsets. \We can break out of our fears and anxieties, and enter into the peace and comfort of God.

As we enter now into the season of fall, I want to share the poem below with you, "I Go Among Trees" by Wendell Berry:



I go among trees and sit still. All my stirring becomes quiet around me like circles on water. My tasks lie in their places where I left them, asleep like cattle. Then what is afraid of me comes and lives a while in my sight. What it fears in me leaves me, and the fear of me leaves it. It sings, and I hear its song. Then what I am afraid of comes. I live for a while in its sight. What I fear in it leaves it, and the fear of it leaves me. It sings, and I hear its song. After days of labor, mute in my consternations, I hear my song at last, and I sing it. I invite you to take some time this autumn to read and re-read this poem, to watch the leaves change and fall, and to consider the majesty and beauty of God's creation all around you. 





#### **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**





**♦**Ron Long, Financial Secretary:

We are seeing little increase in giving and are falling behind.

- **♦ Chris Arany, Treasurer:** Income was around \$9000, and expenses were over \$14,000. Some benevolence giving will wait until the year's end.
- **✦Lana Albright, Spiritual Life:** The membership inactivity policy was changed in our Hope Constitutional By-laws at the August 28th Congregational Meeting. **Kathy Mushaben and Pastor Christie** are gathering info on "Candy for the Troops" for WHOO.
- ◆Bonnie Long, Generosity: There will be a refresher course for CPR & AED's. The deadline for pledge cards and Time and Talent forms will be October 23rd. The Generosity Project meetings

will begin on October 2.

- ♦Council moved that the committee use \$500 from the Wilma Hoffman Fund for Generosity Project Workshop lunches.
- **◆Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship:** The Committee is planning Advent activities and luncheon.
- **♦Jerry Ivins, Digital Ministry:** Council elected Jerry to chair the Digital Ministry Committee.
- ◆The council voted to hire Dennis Bisel to replace our existing sound system with a new amplifier and 4 new speakers for \$10,000 from the Mission Building Fund. The congregation needs to approve.
- ♦Pastor Christie: The Hope sign-up sheet for October 22 "People Working Cooperatively Colerain Day" Isi n the Narthex. The council job description document needs editing. A Safety and Security Workshop for houses of worship is being offered for anyone interested. The Fellowship Hall rental policy needs updating.
- ◆The council voted to pay a member's \$600 rent from the Family Assistance Fund.
- ♦There was a discussion regarding which council members will return and which positions will need to be filled for the 2023 council.
- ♦Names were suggested for members of the Nominating and Budget Committees.
- **♦**The next meeting will be on October 13th, 2022.


Create some invisible art and then reveal the seasonal design.

### What you need:

- Leaves
- White paper
- White crayon (label removed)
- · Watercolor paints
- Water
- · Paintbrush

#### What you do:

- Gather leaves of different shapes and sizes. On a table, arrange them flat without overlaps. Set the paper over them.
- Hold the crayon sideways and use the long edge to color over the leaves. You'll make an invisible rubbing of them.
- 3. Then paint over the paper with watercolors. The areas with crayon will resist the paint and reveal the hidden leaf designs.
