COMING SOON: THE GENEROSITY PROJECT

The Generosity Team is excited to announce a new opportunity for our congregation: The Generosity Project. The Generosity Project is an expression of

the ELCA churchwide initiative to grow faithful stewards and generous leaders, so all may grow in their capacity to recognize and respond to God's abundant grace and generosity – in congregations and at home. The goals of the project are to connect people ages



2 to 102, equip all ages and households for the faith practice of generosity, and to grow in God's grace generation to generation. Hope's Generosity Team looks forward to bringing this initiative to Hope beginning October 2nd.

The Generosity Project will be presented in 6 sessions, and the committee will offer an in-person option and a virtual option.

PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Generosity & Abundance in Christ

Over the next few months, we'll be talking about generosity here at Hope. October begins not only our annual Stewardship/Generosity



Pledge Drive, but also a new series that our Generosity Team is leading, entitled "The Generosity Project." You may begin to wonder why we are discussing this so frequently and why you would want to sign up for the Generosity Project workshops (and you absolutely DO want to sign up!). All of this "generosity" talk is not simply about giving money to the church. It's about shifting our entire mindset: from scarcity to abundance, from focusing on ourselves to focusing on others, and from cultural expectations to Jesus's expectations.

In this passage from John, Jesus says that he has come so that his sheep — his followers, all of us — may have life and have it abundantly. Life, obviously, is good, desirable, important. How much more so, then, abundant life. The chance to not simply persist, but thrive, to not simply exist, but flourish. To have a sense of meaning, purpose, and fulfillment; to know



and be known, accept and be accepted. I believe that if there is one thing that pretty much everyone in our congregations (and outside of them!) desires — even if they can't name that desire — it's this. More than that, I believe we

regularly make all kinds of sacrifices in the hope to earn or achieve or purchase this life, and each time we fail it kills us just a little. (https://www.workingpreacher.org/dear-working-preacher/abundant-life-2)

Dr. Lose continues in his article to talk about the ways in which society teaches us so many lessons that are contrary to this "abundant life" that Jesus wants for us. In particular, Lose highlights the marketing industry, and how our American culture has been shaped by the messages we constantly hear in advertisements.

We all are bombarded by advertisements every day that tell us we will only be happy and fulfilled

if we purchase a new car or a diamond ring or a certain type of soda or whatever the advertiser is selling. In truth, we are so much happier when we learn to be fulfilled by the things that money cannot buy – love, grace, forgiveness, and most importantly, Jesus.

As Hope offers The Generosity Project and other opportunities to learn about how to live abundantly, I hope that you <u>ALL</u> (everyone from ages 2 – 102!!) will take advantage of these opportunities. As we learn more about living abundantly in Christ, we will grow in faith together as individuals and as Hope Lutheran Church.


WHOO (WOMEN HELPING OTHERS & OURSELVES)
