PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Hope, Peace, Joy, and love

Each Sunday during Advent, we light a candle on the Advent wreath, and each week's candle lighting has a different theme: hope, peace, joy, and love. How can we as Christians embody these



themes – during Advent and all year long?

Hope - "[The people] shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore." (Isaiah 2:4-5)

The first Sunday in Advent is not about waiting for Jesus to come as a baby in the manger, but rather is about awaiting the <u>second</u> coming of Christ. Some of the scriptures seem scary rather than hopeful. And yet – the hope here is about the time when Christ returns to us, and all things in the world are made right according to God's will. As the above Isaiah passage notes, there won't be a need for weapons any longer and there will be no more war. We look toward this time when there will be peace and justice, all people will have enough, and there will be equality for everyone. As people of Christ, we look hopefully toward this time. But we cannot stop there. How can our hope for this future perfect world be manifested in our actions here and now?

Peace - "May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 15:5-6)

We see conflict around us every day – in the world, our nation and community, our churches, families, and homes, even in our own hearts. How can we be people of peace amid so much conflict, strife, and suffering? In Paul's letter the Romans, he indicates that this peace begins in our faith communities. If we as a church are at peace with one another and with Christ, the world will see that, and Christ will be glorified. This doesn't mean that we will always agree on everything, but it does mean that we can seek that peace with one another even when we disagree. God gives us the gift of peace in our hearts, so that we may seek to live in peace with one another, thus glorifying God.

Joy- "But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11) The shepherds were watching their sheep in the deep darkness of the middle of the night, when they were shocked by the appearance of a bright light and a bunch

of angels, sharing the good news of Jesus' birth. In the same way, God interrupts the darkness in our lives with the light of Christ. We remember this each year at Christmas time, but we are also called to



live with this same joy every day of the year. This "good news of great joy" is a message that lives in our hearts every day. The joy of Christ in our hearts overcomes the sorrow of even the darkest night.

Love - "God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him." (1 John 4:9)

According to 1 John, we experience God's love by living in Christ. John reminds us that we did not do anything to earn or deserve God's love for us, or God's gift for us in Christ, but God loves us so much that God sent Jesus to show us how to love. John also reminds us that the way others experience Christ is through us. People may not be able to see God, but they can us. People can see how we love, and that is how others experience the love of Christ.






What you need:

- Hide stones for younger siblings to find, set out a new stone each day or order them in a row and tell the Nativity story.


