PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

Amazing Grace for Lent

This year commemorates the 250th anniversary of the hymn "Amazing Grace." To celebrate, our theme for Lent will be "Amazing Grace." Our Thursday worship and Bible Study will explore this theme each week, and a daily devotional will be available in the Narthex for everyone to take home. Each week during Sunday worship, we will explore the themes of just how amazing God's grace truly is, through scripture, sermon, and song. Here is some background on the hymn to give us some insight as we begin our study of this topic:



"Amazing Grace" is a Christian hymn penned by the English poet and Anglican clergyman John Newton to accompany a sermon he preached on New Year's Day, 1773...

Newton wrote the words of "Amazing Grace" from his own personal experience. He was once a man far from faith who was brought near to God by a harrowing event in his life. In 1748, while Newton served as a sea captain of a ship in the Atlantic slave trade, a violent storm off the coast of Ireland struck his vessel so severely that he called out to God for mercy. This moment marked Newton's turn toward God, what he called "the hour I first believed." Eventually leaving sailing behind, Newton then began studying Christian theology and was ordained in the Church of England in 1764. He served as a minister in Olney, England, where he began writing hymns.

"Amazing Grace" was published in Olney Hymns in 1779 but was rarely sung in England. It was in the United States where the song would become



widely known during the early 1800s. While the hymn was associated with more than 20 melodies over the years, in 1835, American composer

William Walker set it to the tune known as "New Britain," and the melody stuck. Today "Amazing Grace" remains one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world." (Creative Communications Website Amazing Grace History, 2023)

I look forward to exploring this theme with you throughout Lent. As we learn more together about this beautiful hymn, I hope that we also will find a deeper understanding of God's grace, as manifested in Jesus's ultimate sacrifice on the cross.

May God's grace abound in your lives throughout this Lenten season!

-And one gift certificate for the Cincinnati Arts Association for \$300 so she can go to any show she would like, and take someone with her. (I'm available, Pastor.)

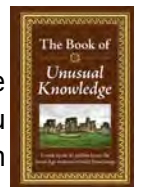

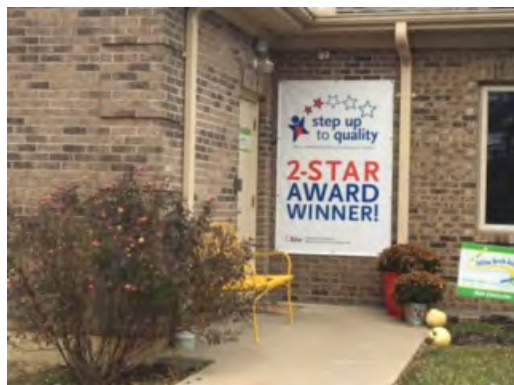

◆The next meeting is February 9, 2023.

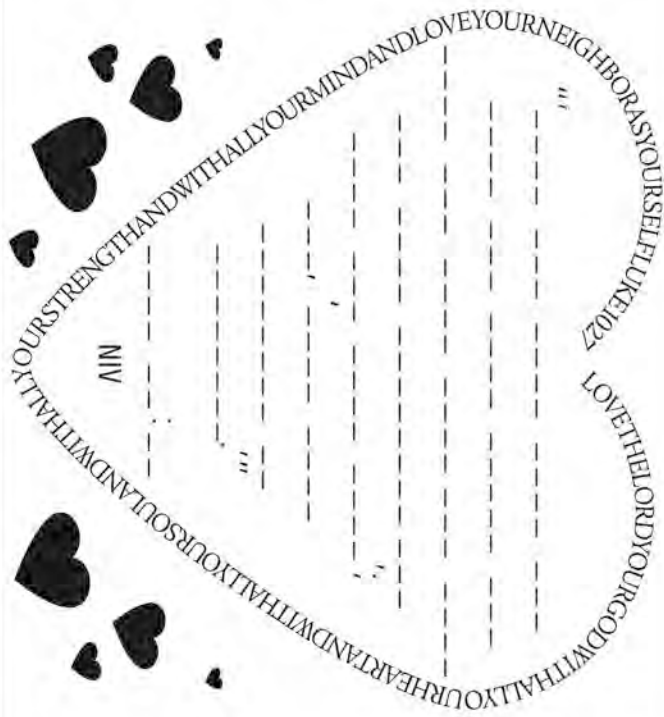

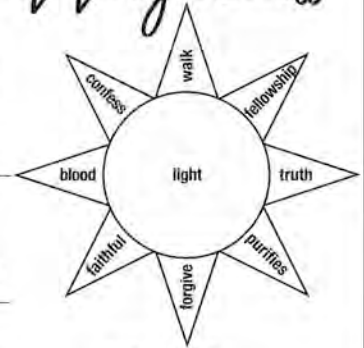
