SUPER PIGGY SUNDAY RESULTS

The children of Hope, in partnership with the Generosity Committee, embarked on a mission to



provide for families around the world who are suffering from hunger or food insecurity. Through the ELCA World Hunger program, children collected money starting in October to "feed" ELCA Good the piggy banks they made during Gifts Fund Children's Church.

This project culminated in "Super Piggy Sunday" on February 12th. With support from the congregation, the children raised a total of \$500! Now the children will choose a sustainable way to use their funds to help a family in need. This could be through the purchase of chicks that will ultimately produce eggs, a cow that will produce milk, or a fish farm.

Over the past three and a half years, our Congregational Vitality Team (CVT) here at Hope



has been working Southern Ohio Synod through Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

God's work. Our hands program called The Collaborative. This program is offered by the ELCA Southern Ohio Synod, and is geared toward helping churches to have strong plans, mission, and

vision for the future of the congregation.

I am happy to report that we are finally in the home stretch of this program! The CVT finished our final retreat/workshop event with the Collaborative in February. However, I realized during this "final" event, that the work for us here at Hope is far from over. In fact, the most challenging and rewarding step of the process is just beginning for us as a congregation.

Here is what we've done so far in the process: We have learned about ourselves as a church - our strengths, passions, and values as a congregation and as individuals. We have talked with the community and learned guite a bit about what the

needs are here in Colerain We developed a Township. congregational purpose TACKLING statement. The purpose QUESTIONS statement answers the



question, "What's our WHY?" Why do we do the things we do as a church? Why do we exist? The purpose statement that the congregation approved this past fall is: "Sharing God's grace, hope, and love to our community through service, hospitality, compassion, and prayer."

We now move on to the next step in our process, which is to identify a "Signature Ministry." Our signature ministry will tie all these things together: our purpose, passions, values, and gifts with the needs of the community. To find this signature ministry, we might ask ourselves: What are we doing now that we could do more of to help more people in the community? What are we so passionate about that we want to share it with the world? And, most importantly, What is God calling us to do?

Each of you will have many opportunities over the coming months to engage in conversations around this topic. I am incredibly excited to see where the Holy Spirit is leading us. I am fully confident that though a new initiative may seem like a frightening endeavor, God will equip us in ways we never imagined! "For God all things are possible."

Yes, this might be a scary adventure for us. But remember the topics we've been discussing over these past few years about having an abundance mentality verses a scarcity mentality? Each time we lead with that abundance mentality, we allow God room to get into the situation and move! Over all the years that Hope Lutheran Church has been a congregation together, each time we as a congregation have said - "I don't know how we're going to do this but I know God is calling us to do this, and I know God will equip us with what we need," God has come through. God has answered our prayers. God has made the dreams and visions of Hope a reality. And God will do so again.

Let's face our future together here at Hope with hearts full of abundance! Let's dream together about what the next phase of our ministry looks like. As we do so, seeking the leading of the Holy Spirit in all that we do. I know that God will bless us. Nothing is impossible with God!


