PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Being Fruitful

Be fruitful and multiply – Gen. 1:28 This time of year is a good time to think about being fruitful. Plants are growing and blooming, and quite soon our favorite fruits will begin to ripen on the vine. There is



nothing quite like picking a fruit, or even a vegetable, directly out of the garden and being able to eat it right away.

In the lectionary texts for Sunday June 4, Genesis 1 takes a prominent role. We get to experience the whole creation story again, remembering how "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (v. 1). It's a beautiful story of how God lovingly created the earth, the sky, the waters, and all the creatures on the earth, including humans.

After God has created humans in God's image, God tells all of the creatures to be fruitful and multiply. Historically, this has sometimes been interpreted to encourage us to have children, and that certainly made sense for "in the beginning" when there were only a few of each creature on the earth. But in our context today, I wonder if we can look at being fruitful in a slightly different way.

There are many ways to bear fruit for God. Perhaps being fruitful and multiplying can be to share our faith or share the love of Christ with others, bearing fruit by helping to bring others closer to God. In Galatians, Paul talks about the "fruit of the spirit," which he describes as "love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (5:22). These behaviors are all ways that we can be fruitful for Christ.

Another Biblical theme I always consider this time of year is that of death and resurrection. All the fruit fell to the ground last fall, their plants appearing dead all through the winter months. And now, in the spring, just after we have celebrated Christ's resurrection on Easter, we see those plants beginning to grow again, from the very seeds that fell from lifeless plants several months ago.

Perhaps we find ourselves somewhere in that cycle of death and resurrection at various points in our lives. Sometimes we feel like those lifeless, leafless plants in the winter. Sometimes we're the seeds that fell from the plants in the fall full of life and yet not quite ready to grow into a new plant. And other times, we are full of the life of Christ and ready to burst into bloom.

Wherever we each find ourselves as we head into the summer months, let's think about being fruitful. Every time we see a flower in bloom, a fruit just about to ripen, or a newly picked vegetable – let's say a little prayer. Let's ask God, "How can I be more fruitful in my life, right now, for YOU, God?" We may find ourselves blossoming with the fruits of the spirit in ways that we never expected.

- **†**Erica Leppert, Christian Education: Sunday School will continue during the summer, but volunteers are needed for Sundays that she will not be at church.


- ◆Becky Lister/Linda McBride, Outreach: A luncheon is scheduled for May 7th for potential members.
