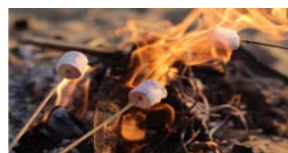

PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

Teach Us to Pray

In the gospels of both Matthew and Luke, Jesus instructs the disciples on how to pray. Matthew's version is the closest to what we now refer to as "The Lord's Prayer:"



*Our Father in heaven,
may your name be revered as holy.
May your kingdom come.
May your will be done
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And do not bring us to the time of trial,
but rescue us from the evil one. – Matthew 6:9-13*

But this sample prayer is not all Jesus has to teach about prayer. He gives many other instructions and examples. Jesus tells the disciples to be persistent, and that all they need to do is ask in God's name and they will receive (Luke 11:5-13). Jesus also instructs the disciples not to use prayer to connect with God one-on-one, rather than for trying to appear holy for others (Matthew 6:1-18). Many times throughout the gospels, we see Jesus going away to pray in private or with only his disciples. Just after teaching the disciples about prayer, he tells them not to worry (Matthew 6:25-34), perhaps implying that once we have submitted our prayers to God, we can let go of our worries, knowing that all is in God's hands.



With so many examples from Jesus, not to mention countless other guides about prayer that have been written over many years, we might

wonder, DO we know how to pray?

Jesus may have given us one primary example for words to use during prayer, but he had many other things to say about prayer. Also, countless Christians and authors over hundreds of years have suggested numerous different prayer styles. We all find God and talk to God in different ways.

Many of us often have questions such as: What are some good prayer styles that will work for me? How can I better connect to God during prayer? How can I be disciplined to pray more often? How can I

remember all the people for whom I want to pray today? How do I make time to listen for God, in addition to asking for stuff?

We discussed several of these questions at our Prayer Chain Breakfast in May, and I have been thinking all summer about more ways that we can explore these topics together. Therefore, this fall, our Bible Study sessions (Thursdays at 1pm) will be on the topic of prayer. We will explore **The Lord's Prayer** and other forms of prayer from Jesus's teachings and throughout the Bible. We will also look at different styles of prayer and several authors who have written prayers and books about prayer, such as **Richard Rohr, Kate Bowler, Barbara Brown Taylor, and Bill Hybels.**

I am also interested in continuing to explore this topic in other ways throughout our church life together. Please reach out to me if you have ideas for study topics, other activities in addition to Thursday Bible Study time, books that you'd like to share, or any questions. If there are some folks who are interested in this but unavailable on Thursday afternoons, let me know and we can explore an additional study time. I look forward to sharing together on this very important topic of prayer!

Hope received an award from **Team Up to Green Up**

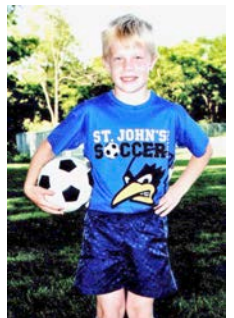


Colerain. It's called a Snazzy Award, and the organization is awarding these to businesses around Colerain for keeping our property "snazzy" and beautifying our area of the community.

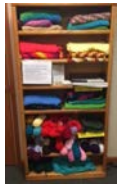

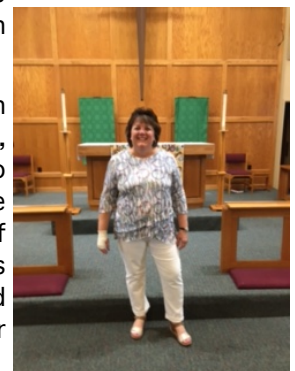


STAND-INS FOR PASTOR CHRISTIE

August 10, 2023

Ron Long, Financial Secretary: Our total revenue lists some members who gave their year's donation in a lump sum.

♦**Lana Albright, Spiritual Life:** A committee meeting is scheduled for August 24 with a 10 item agenda.

♦**Joy Ivins, Worship/Music:** The Outdoor Worship Service went well as did the two services while pastor was on vacation. The fall services will have a slightly different structure. The next committee meeting is scheduled for September 13th.

♦**Becky Lister/Linda McBride, Outreach:** The committee has been divided up into sub categories to make it easier to work on special projects. There are two new members on the committee.

♦**Bonnie Long, Generosity:** The Fall Campaign is under way. AED classes will begin at the end of August at church. The committee will meet again on August 24th.



♦**Chuck Hasdorff, Property:** The broken sanctuary window is fixed and will cost us our \$500 deductible. The kitchen refrigerator was repaired for \$360. The fallen gutter was repaired for \$1800. The exhaust fan in the women's restroom needs replaced. (Busy Month!)

4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.



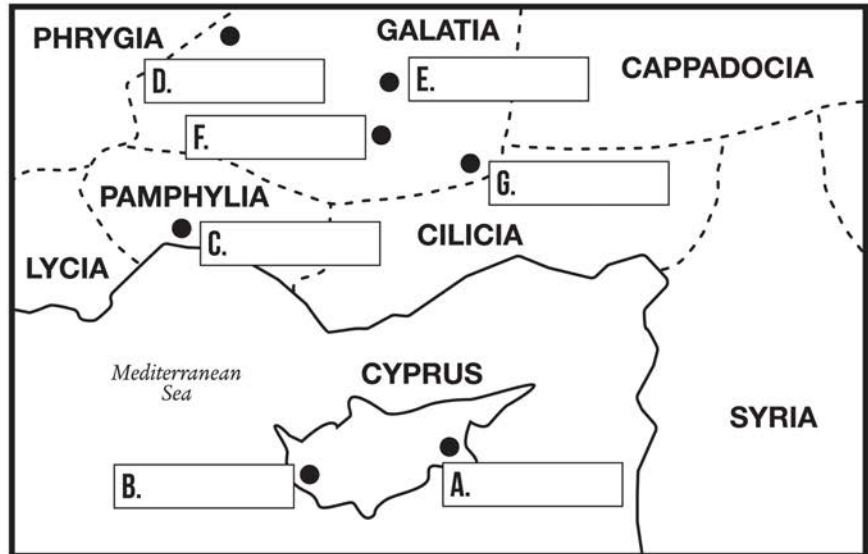


