## **GRIEFSHARE SUPPORT GROUP**

January 29 – April 2

I am very excited to announce that Hope will begin hosting our first Griefshare Support Group beginning January 29. Griefshare is a nationally-recognized program that provides resources for churches to host these 13-week, Christian-based sessions for those who are mourning the loss of a loved one. Here's a little more about Griefshare:

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful, confusing process. A GriefShare group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. At this 13-week support group program, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way. At each weekly meeting, you will view a video featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus you'll hear relatable personal stories of grief. After that is a small-group discussion to allow people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned on the video. Everyone will receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating their personal grieving process.

ALL are welcome. This program is designed to care for Hope's members <u>and</u> for our larger community, so please share this information with anyone you know who may benefit. The cost is only \$20 to cover the cost of a workbook; everything else is free of charge. Registration information will be available soon. # PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Entertaining Angels

"...some have entertained angels unawares." – Hebrews 3:2 (KJV)

As I write this, the worship team and I are in the process of preparing for our Hanging of the Greens



worship Sunday, which will be Dec. 3. This is always a special service, full of readings, beautiful music, and the decorating of the sanctuary for Advent and Christmas. This year's service has bit of a different theme to it than our similar services in past years. As we decorate and sing this year, we will be learning about angels.

In my research for this worship service, I learned many things about how angels appear in the Bible, and I wanted to share with you a few things that surprised me.

First, I was surprised by the number of times that angels are mentioned in the Bible – it's over 325 times, and the book of Revelation alone mentions angels 75 times. Maybe angels are all around us in our lives as well, and we fail to notice them.

The second thing that surprised me was the first appearance of an angel in the Bible. It is in Genesis, but the angel's first appearance isn't to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, or any of the important people we might normally think would get the first angel visit. The first visit is to Hagar, a fairly minor character, a



female slave in the household of Abraham, the mother of Abraham's first son, Ishmael. In Hagar's relatively short story, an angel of the lord

finds her in the wilderness, twice, both times afraid and lonely. The second time she feared that she and her son would starve to death. The angels provided for Hagar, comforted her, and brought God's promises of assurance.

I find it comforting that God saw Hagar's distress, and sent angels to help her. But angels aren't always comforting. Angels can be messengers of comfort, peace, and visions of Glory. However, they can also be warriors and protectors, and sometimes even harbingers of death. Perhaps this is why angels in the gospels often appear with the words, "Fear not!" as they attempt to comfort their audience.

Whether they are bringing good news or bad, the appearance of an angel is <u>always</u> important in scripture. Sometimes, people fail to recognize that they are speaking to an angel. Other times, they don't believe the angel or they do not listen to the angel's message. Hebrews 13:2 says, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels unawares."

This makes me wonder... when have we entertained angels without realizing? If we look around this holiday season, and really take time to notice, will we see angels all around us? Possibly. We might notice that God has sent someone into our lives to care for and protect us, or maybe it's a stranger sharing an important message, or possibly an angel in the disguise of someone in need. Whatever the case, may our eyes to opened to the wonder of angels around us, and may we take the time to notice and to listen. May God bless you throughout Advent and Christmas, and always.

### WHAT IS ADVENT?

Advent is a season observed in most Christian denominations as a time of expectant waiting and the



celebration of the Nativity of Christ. The Lutheran Book of Worship lists blue as the preferred color for Advent while the Methodist Book of Worship and the Presbyterian Book of Common Worship identify purple or blue as appropriate for Advent. Proponents of this new liturgical trend argue that purple is traditionally associated with solemnity and somberness, which is fitting to the repentant character of Lent. There has been an increasing trend in Protestant churches to supplant purple with blue during Advent as it is a hopeful season of preparation that anticipates both Bethlehem and the consummation of history in the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.

Christian Church after they receive their SON food boxes at Groesbeck Methodist Church.


## HOPE'S CAROL'S TREE

Wednesday, December 20, 7 p.m. Saint Paul Old Blue Rock Church


Join church members from Hope and from around Colerain Township, as we worship

### **November 9, 2023**

- **♦ Chris Arany, Treasurer:** Income so far this year is \$169,253.87 with expenses of \$198,680.24.
- **Lana Albright, Spiritual Life:** The next meeting of the committee will be December 7. A luncheon was served after Terry Heybruch's funeral.
- **♦Joy Ivins, Worship/Music:** The committee purchased a new Christmas tree since the current tree is so hard to erect. Hopefully, we can sell the old one. The organist and music director contracts are being updated. The committee's next meeting is January 10th.
- **♦Erica Leppert, Christian Education: She will present the Children's Message on December 17.**
- ◆Becky Lister/Linda McBride, Outreach: With a Thrivent grant, Christmas gifts will be purchased for Little Brothers of the Elderly.
- **♦Bonnie Long, Generosity:** Time and Talent forms will be sent to those who have not completed one.

- **◆Karen Schweinfest**, **Fellowship**: Thanks to all who helped with the Hope Bonfire.
- ◆ Chuck Hasdorff Property: Everything is ok for now.
- **♦Jerry Ivins, Digital Ministry:** ChurchTrac has added an email program for an additional \$88.80 per year.
- ◆The council passed the motion to add the email for \$88.80 per year to Churchtrac for a total of \$388 with the accounting and directory program.
- **◆Pastor Christie:** "Grief Share" for Hope.was added to the budget for next year for \$595, a one time expense.
- **♦**She will be on vacation December 25th through January 7th.
- **Security** and Safety Committee presented some recommendations to council. They will work on a social media plan for 2024.
- ◆Council would like **Brian Byrne** and some one from Colerain tTownship to discuss strategies and tips on violent incidents.
- ◆Sue asked for council suggestions for 2024 Hope goals.
- **♦**The Hope Constitution review was tabled until January.
- ◆Council moved to change the name of the Stewardship Committee to Generosity and Evangelism Committee to Outreach.
- ♦The 2024 Budget was passed to present to the congregation for approval at the November 19 meeting.
- ♦Council voted to give consent to 2 churches combining in Mansfield Ohio to use the name Hope Lutheran Church.
- ♦The slate of council 2024 members has openings for Recording Secretary and Generosity Chair.
- **◆**The next meeting will. be December 13 at 7 pm at the home of Karen Schweinfest.

- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



#### What you do:

- Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.


