GRIEFSHARE SUPPORT GROUP



Coming to Hope! Mondays 4-6 p.m. January 29 – April 2

I am very excited to announce that Hope will begin hosting our first Griefshare Support Group beginning January 29. Griefshare is a nationally-recognized program that provides resources for churches to host these 13week, Christian-based sessions for those who are mourning the loss of a loved one. Here's a little more about Griefshare:

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful, confusing process. A GriefShare group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. At this 13week support group program, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability-and gain solid support each step of the way. At each weekly meeting, you will view a video featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus you'll hear relatable personal stories of grief. After that is a smallgroup discussion to allow people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned on the video. Everyone will receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating their personal grieving process.

ALL are welcome. This program is designed to care for Hope's members and for our larger community, so please share this information with anyone you know who may benefit. The cost is only \$20 to cover the cost of a workbook; everything else is free of charge. Registration information will be available soon. PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER All Things New

Behold, I am making all things new – Isaiah 43:18

Some nights before I go to sleep, I pray the Ignatian Examen. The Examen is a spiritual practice



(created by St. Ignatius) that is designed to be prayed at night. When we pray the Examen, we think back through our entire day, and we thank God for ALL of it... not just the amazing, wonderful things, but the painful moments, and even the moments filled with small, mundane things. After we thank God for each element of our day, we then think back through those moments, and we notice when we felt closest to God and when we felt more distant from God. We end the prayer by setting an intention for the next day.

When I do this, I often find a sense of renewal. I can close out the chapter of this day. I can let go of all the fears and mistakes. I can forgive and ask for forgiveness, ready to move into the next day with a purpose that is focused on God's will for my life.

As we close out 2023 and look toward a new year – I wonder, what if we pray the Ignatian Examen for the whole year? What if we look back at everything that has happened this past year? Can we find the gratitude in every moment? Can we identify times when we felt closest to God? Can we set an intention for 2024, to allow God to create and renew all things within us?

God is indeed making all things new. Sometimes it doesn't feel that way. Sometimes we must work hard to find that newness, the joy, the gratitude, the renewal that God brings to us each day. What better time to seek that than in the new year?

Pastor and author Rob Bell writes: "The world is fractured, broken; parts are lying scattered all over the place—and it brings God pleasure to bring it all back together in unity. In Christ." Bell continues on to note that God is indeed making all things new: "Your broken heart? All things. Poverty? All things. Abuse? All things... Fractured relationships? All things. All things. All things." Bell asks, "What would it look like to live like this is true?"

What WOULD it look like, if we live into 2024 with the full knowledge that God is making <u>all things</u> new? What if we thank God for each and every moment of 2023, identifying the moments when we felt closest to God? What if we set an intention for the new year to seek more of those moments of closeness, more of those moments of renewal? What if we pledge to live in such a way in 2024 that others can see the newness of Christ alive in us?

May God bless and keep you in this new year, Pastor Christie
