COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

March 14, 2024

◆Ron Long, Financial Secretary:

He reported a \$11,475 memorial donation was given, and some donated stock shares were sold for \$22,743.11.

◆Chris Arany, Treasurer: Our monthly income exceeded our expenses. The CD matures on July 24, 2024.

◆Lana Albright, Spiritual Life: Hope will sponsor a Nation Day of Prayer Vigil on May 2. A set of wind chimes is given to the family of Hope's deceased members after the funeral.

◆Joy Ivins, Worship/Music: Lenten services are going well. The "Celebrating 5 Years of Ministry" caught pastor off guard. June 23 will be our annual outdoor service in the Meditation Garden.

Kayla Terbruggen would like to resign from her

position of nursery attendant. We will be seeking a replacement.

◆Outreach: Pastor is preparing an informational series to acquaint prospective members about Hope.

◆Erica Leppert, Christian Ed: The children will make centerpieces for the Easter Breakfast Table. She will present the Children's Message on Palm Sunday.

◆Bonnie Long, Generosity: They are collecting money for Love Packages. Ron Long discussed a 2 year synod program "Stewardship for All Seasons" at a cost of \$2000 a year to generate donations. Council moved to schedule a Congregational Meeting on April 14 to discuss and vote on the program.

◆Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship: The Easter Breakfast will be prepared by the Byrne Family with a sign up in the Narthex.

◆Jerry Ivins, Digital Ministry: There was a meeting with Colerain Township about the sign permit. When granted, payment for the sign will be due.

◆Pastor Christie: The Griefshare program is going well. No youth are planning to go to the ELCA Youth Gathering this summer.

◆Sue Millard, President: The congregation is invited to attend the Strategic Planning Meeting on April 7 at 1 pm.

A LOVE-FILLED VICTORY

It's tough to read about Jesus' agony on the cross, where he felt "forsaken" by God (see Matthew 27:46). But as Philip Yancey explains in *Where Is God When It Hurts?* the Father didn't desert Jesus — and doesn't desert us:



"God was not 'up there' watching the tragic events conspire 'down here.' God was *in Christ*, reconciling the world to himself," he writes. "If Jesus was a mere man, his death would prove God's cruelty; the fact that he was God's Son proves instead that God fully identifies with suffering humanity. On the cross, God himself absorbed the awful pain of this world.

"To some, the image of a pale body glimmering on a dark night whispers of defeat," Yancey continues. "But another sound can be heard: the shout of a God crying out to human beings, 'I LOVE YOU.' Love was compressed for all history in that lonely figure on the cross, who said that he could call down angels at any moment on a rescue mission, but chose not to — because of us."

He concludes: "Any discussion of how pain and suffering fit into God's scheme ultimately leads back to the cross."

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.

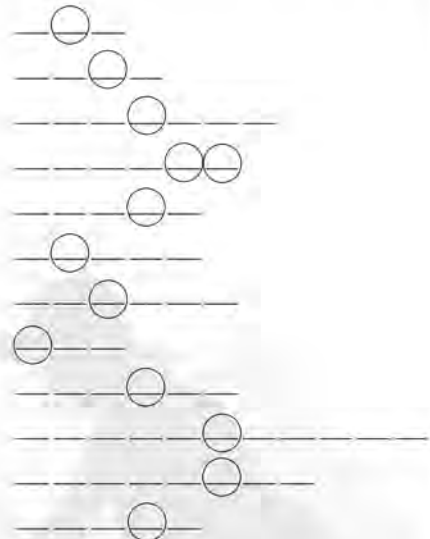
