PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Covenant and Wilderness

On Sunday mornings during this season of Lent, one of the themes we will be exploring is the theme of "Covenant." Normally during Lent we talk about "wilderness," and we will see in the scriptures for this



Lent, that every time God intervenes to make a new covenant with the people, it is after a period of wilderness. Whenever things feel like they are at their worst, God brings hope into our lives.

Not every "wilderness" period takes place in the desert, as evidenced by Noah's situation. Noah and his endured 40 days of rain and 150 days in the Ark before they found dry land. (Gen. 7-9). At the end of the flood, God makes a new covenant with Noah and his descendants. God provides the rainbow, to remind both God and humans that God will never again destroy the earth with a flood.

We will also see the Israelites wandering in the wilderness after their escape from Egypt. God makes a covenant with the Israelites in the form of the Ten Commandments (Ex. 20:1-17). We might tend to view the Ten Commandments as a simply a list of rules. However, these new rules were quite liberating to the Hebrew people after their time spent in slavery under Pharaoh. To Pharaoh, the people were commodities, possessions. He worked them tirelessly so that he could gain more from their labor. Pharaoh was willing to lie, cheat, steal, and kill to get what he wanted. As God brings the people out of Egypt, God's message through the covenant of the Ten Commandments is basically this: 'I am not like Pharaoh. There will be no more killing or lying, stealing, or cheating. Take a day off and rest every week.' This is the covenant God makes with the nation that would become Israel - a covenant of liberation, not of restriction.

In Jeremiah 31:31-34, the prophet Jeremiah is speaking to the people of Israel many generations later. Israel has been conquered and Jerusalem destroyed. Many people were taken into exile in Babylon and others were killed. The Israelites have lost faith and hope. And God says through Jeremiah, "I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah... I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be

their God, and they shall be my people... I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more." God promises to remain with the people, to make this new covenant of forgiveness, even though the people have doubted God and strayed from the law.

Today, we may know full well what it feels like to walk through periods of wilderness during our lives. It's important for us to remember that God walks alongside of us during all times, including those that feel most like a desert or a flood or a time of barrenness and exile. Just when things seem to be at their most difficult, this is when we are reminded that God has been by our sides all along. God makes new covenants and reveals the beauty around us that we hadn't noticed before.

Renewed in hope, what covenants is God making with you this Lenten season? What new things is God doing in your life? And what new possibilities do you see for us here at Hope Lutheran Church? We move forward in faith, knowing that God's promises never fail us.



which flows from his intimate communion with the One who sent him. It is a joy that does not separate happy days from sad days, successful


moments from moments of failure, experiences of honor from experiences of dishonor, passion from resurrection.

February 18, 2024


♦Ron Long, Financial Secretary:





RESURRECTION RUMBLINGS

In Easter Earthquake, James A. Harnish explores the "earthshaking promise" of Jesus' resurrection. Easter Sunday "shatters the power of fear," he writes. "Because Christ is risen, we no longer allow fear to dominate, control or manipulate us. We don't remain imprisoned in the tombs of our past failures or buried under the weight of present anxiety. In the risen Christ, old things pass away and everything becomes new."

Easter, Harnish adds, is proof that God hasn't forsaken us and is present among us. "The Resurrection contradicts the assumption that Christ resides on an ethereal cloud in a distant heaven. Rather, we find him on the dusty road that leads to the real stuff of our ordinary world."

Jesus' followers can find him everywhere, Harnish concludes. "The risen Christ will meet us along the confused, chaotic, fearful paths of our lives and speak the same words the women hear at the tomb, 'Do not be afraid.'" Churchart.c



Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- · Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help




What you do:

- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then
