CONGREGATIONAL MEETING RESULTS

At the special Congregational Meeting on April 14, those attending voted to approve the motion to contract with the Southern Ohio Synod's" Stewardship for All Seasons" program to help our Hope carry out productive stewardship programs year round and generate more money for ministry, energized stewards, and a culture of generosity. The 2 year program costs \$2000 per year plus 10% of the increase to help reimburse the synod for the overall cost associated with the program.

PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER May Days Ablaze

May is a wonderful month, as evidenced by the 1st day of May being commemorated internationally as "May Day," a day to celebrate spring and flowers. In addition to May Day, the month of May is full of



special national and international holidays including Cinco de Mayo (5/5), Mother's Day (5/12), and Memorial Day (5/26). Of course, May also features fun and silly holidays such as Star Wars Day (5/4), Lost Sock Memorial Day (5/9), and National Frog Jumping Day (5/13).

May is also a special month for us in the church. May 2 is National Day of Prayer. On this date, we are all invited to take time out of our busy schedules in whatever way works best for us, and pray. At Hope, we will meet at 1 p.m. Thursday for a special time of prayer, and the sanctuary will be open from 2pm-4pm for prayer.

And on May 19, we celebrate Pentecost. You might remember that often in worship on Pentecost Sunday, we have candles all around and I light a fire in the baptismal font. And you might be wondering – Why do we do all that? Or, What's so special about Pentecost anyway?

Pentecost is the day when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. In the Bible, after Jesus's death, resurrection, and ascension, the disciples weren't quite sure what to do. Their life's purpose had been to follow Jesus, and they weren't sure how to do that once he ascended into Heaven. And then one day soon after, the Holy Spirit entered the room where they were praying, in a rush of wind and fire.

This is what we celebrate on Pentecost Sunday -



that rush of fire that is the Holy Spirit. The Spirit can fulfill a lot of roles for us – it can comfort us and bring peace. The Spirit can whisper to us in a still, small voice or help us to feel its presence with a gentle breeze. AND, the Holy Spirit can

really get us moving. The Spirit bring us inspiration and energy, fire and passion, and all of this encompassed in the live-giving breath of God.

These days at Hope Lutheran Church, we are looking toward the future in amazing ways. We are identifying Hope's Signature Ministry and embarking upon "Stewardship For All Seasons." We are dreaming and planning together, we are growing in our faith and in our connection to God and one another. We are listening to where the Holy Spirit is leading us.

In my experience, whenever the Holy Spirit comes in a rush of wind and fire, powerful and life-giving change is about to come. As we look toward these beautiful days of May, let's allow the Holy Spirit to set our hearts ablaze with passion and love for a future with HOPE!



April 11, 2024

- **◆Ron Long, Financial Secretary:** The Memorial Fund received a \$5000 donation to be spent toward the electronic outdoor sign.
- **♦Chris Arany, Treasurer:** Our monthly income exceeded our expenses.
- *Joy Ivins, Worship/Music: We need a Nursery Attendant during worship services. Holy Week services went well with over 150 in attendance on Easter Sunday. The next committee meeting is scheduled for May 1st.
- **♦Outreach:** Hope still needs a chairperson for this committee.
- **♦Erica Leppert, Christian Ed:** She will continue Sunday Children's Church during the summer except for Sundays when she is on vacation.

- ♦ Bonnie Long, Generosity: Ron Long discussed a 2 year synod program "Stewardship for All Seasons which has a fee of \$2000 per year plus 10% of the increase generated from the program. The council passed the motion from the committee to the congregation for a vote at a meeting on April 14 following the worship service.

AFLAME WITH FAITH


In the Old Testament, fire often symbolizes the presence of God's Spirit. For example, God called to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:2-6) and

defeated the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18:30-39). In the New Testament, tongues of fire rested atop the believers gathered on Pentecost (Acts 2:3).

Some Christians have described a burning or current-like sensation when they encounter God. Methodism founder John Wesley said his heart was "strangely warmed" during worship. After such an encounter, people often feel compelled to share the Good News of Jesus. The flame of faith inside one believer can spark a revival of faith in others. As Charles Spurgeon said, "A burning heart will soon find for itself a flaming tongue."
