

PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Summer Sermon Series The Lord's Prayer

[Jesus] was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples" – Luke 11:1



disciples." - Luke 11:1 (NRSVUE)

Recently, Hope's Bible Study group read a book called The Lord's Prayer: The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught" by Adam Hamilton. This book and our study of it gave me many new perspectives on The Lord's Prayer, and it made me think about our own practices of the Lord's Prayer.



We pray this prayer during worship every week – some of us may pray more frequently – and yet we rarely talk about what the prayer means to us. Therefore, this

summer, I will be preaching a sermon series on the Lord's Prayer. I will be sharing some of the perspectives of Adam Hamilton, as well as my own insights and those from some other authors, and I will invite you all to think about your own perspectives as well. Here are the topics we will cover each week, and a few of my preliminary insights about each one:

June 2: Our Father Who Art in Heaven – For the first week, we will talk about the Lord's Prayer as a whole and about God as creator. We will also investigate what it means to talk about God as Father, and our own responsibilities as parents and as those who care for God's creation.

June 9: Hallowed Be Thy Name – When we pray "Hallowed be thy name," how often do we think about what it means for God's name to be "hallowed" or holy? Do we actively strive to make God's name holy through our words and our actions?

June 16: Thy Will Be Done – In our culture, it can be easy for us to focus on "MY" will be done, rather than on God's will. How can we work on setting our own will aside sometimes to make space for God's will in our lives, and how do we discern what is God's will?

June 30: Our Daily Bread – Scripture tells us "One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matt. 4:4, based on Deut. 8:2-6). Do we truly trust that God can supply our every need? What would it look like to live more fully into that faith, and to "let go and let God" more often in our lives?

July 7: Forgive Us Our Trespasses – We pray for God to forgive us every week, not just in the Lord's prayer, but in the Confession & Forgiveness at the beginning of worship. Maybe we even ask God to forgive us multiple times throughout our day or week. But, do we truly believe that God forgives us our sins? Do we practice owning up to our sins and asking others to forgive us? And, are we able to forgive ourselves?

July 21: As We Forgive Those Who Trespass Against Us – Once we've asked God and others to forgive us, and as we begin practicing forgiveness of ourselves, we must think about our forgiveness of others. Does this line of the prayer truly mean that we are asking God to forgive us in the same way that we forgive others? How can we work on forgiving others and still maintain some boundaries to keep others from continuing to hurt us?

July 28: Lead Us, Not Into Temptation – Have you ever thought about putting a comma after "Lead us"? It gives us a whole new meaning to that line. What if we are asking God to lead us and guide us in everything we do, to help us to avoid temptation, nd to protect us from harm?

August 4: For Thine is the Kingdom, Power & Glory – There is great comfort in thinking about God's kingdom coming to earth, not just at the end times, but right here and now. What does that look like, and how does God call us to be leaders of bringing God's kingdom, power, and glory to our world?

I look forward to exploring these topics with you, and I hope that you all have a blessed and safe summer.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS


April 11, 2024

- **♦Ron Long, Financial Secretary:** Total receipts. For April were \$9522.74 plus interest on established funds and the Capital CD.

- *Joy Ivins, Worship/Music: Still no replacement for nursery attendant. Possibly a teen volunteer. Our Summer Outdoor Service will be in the Meditation Garden on June 23.
- **♦Lana Albright, Spiritual Life:** The Red Book which states the official membership of Hope will be reviewed.
- **♦Outreach:** Hope T-shirts will be for sale soon. The committee is planning a Hope Information Fair in

October.

- **♦ Bonnie Long, Generosity: Ron Long** discussed the information and schedule for "Stewardship for All Seasons." There will be an orientation meeting on June 17th at Hope open to everyone.
- **Carmen Hasdorff, Property/Maintenance:** Te closest by the kitchen will be used to store paper supplies.
- **✦Jerry Ivins, Digital Ministry:** Most of the necessary materials for the digital sign have been purchased. Hopefully, it will be finished by the end of June.

REDEEMING 'WASTED' TIME

In *Just Like Jesus*, Max Lucado writes that the average American spends a total of six months waiting at stoplights, eight months opening junk mail, 18 months looking for items we've lost and five years standing in line. All the while, many of us grumble: "What a waste of time! I could be doing something much more important! Where are my keys?"

But Lucado suggests that we give these moments to God. Rather than whispering to ourselves, we can speak to God in prayer. "Simple phrases such as 'Thank you, Father,' 'Be sovereign in this hour, O Lord,' 'You are my resting place, Jesus' can turn a commute into a pilgrimage," he writes. "You needn't leave your office or kneel in your kitchen. Just pray where you are. Let the kitchen become a cathedral or the classroom a chapel. Give God your whispering thoughts."

When we do this, "the common becomes uncommon," Lucado adds. What's more, "wasted" time becomes valuable; boring waits become meditative; the lost — your time, if not also your keys — is redeemed.



Why do stars appear to twinkle? Try this experiment to find out!

What you need:

- Aluminum foil
- · Large glass bowl
- Water



What you do:


- 1. Crumple the foil into a ball. Carefully unfold it and lay it flat on the ground.
- 2. Fill the bowl with water and place it on the foil.
- 3. Turn off the lights and make the room as dark as possible. Shine the flashlight about 1 foot from the water's undisturbed surface. Light will reflect onto the foil.
- 4. Then tap your finger on the water's surface. As the water moves, what happens to the light on the foil?
- 5. This flickering simulates scintillation, which happens when starlight enters Earth's atmosphere. As light passes through layers of gas and water, it refracts and appears to twinkle.


