PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER Journeying with Jesus

"[Jesus said] Go on your way; I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals, and greet no one on the road." – Luke 10:3-4

When I was a kid, we played a

game where we would sit in a circle and say, "I'm going on a trip and I'm taking ____." As we went around the circle, we would go in the order of the alphabet. So, the first person might be taking <u>apples</u> on their trip, the second person might take a <u>b</u>aboon, the third person might take <u>c</u>andy, and so on. When it was your turn, you had to recite the things that the people before you were taking, and then say what you were taking. This of course got more challenging as the game went along and we got closer to the letter Z. We always ended up with quite a crazy assortment of items to take on our journey!

I've been thinking about this game because, as I write this, I am packing and getting ready to depart for a vacation. It's always a process, trying to think of all the things I might need on my trip, all the things that need to be done before I leave, and the things that might need to be taken care of by someone else while I'm gone. I've been slow-packing for about a week now... setting things aside as a I do a load of laundry, ordering refills on my prescriptions, buying dog food so the dog-sitters (thanks Judy and Butch!) will have everything they need to take care of Shadow.

With all this preparation in mind, it's always amazing to me that Jesus sent his followers out on a long trip and told them not to take anything with them (Luke 10:1-11). Why would Jesus say that? What would it matter if the disciples packed up some belongings to take along with them?

First of all, the admonition to pack nothing indicates a sense of urgency for the mission. There is no time for slow-packing or even a hurried moment of stuffing a few things into a bag. The mission is to bring healing and peace to the households, to announce that the kingdom of God is now here on earth, and to recruit new followers. This cannot wait because – Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to be crucified. There is no time for packing lists or for being weighed down on the journey by heavy bags.

Secondly, by taking nothing with them, Jesus's followers must rely upon the hospitality of strangers – and ultimately, they must have extreme faith that God will provide everything they need.

We too are followers of Jesus sent on a mission to bring healing and to spread the good news of Christ. While this may not mean that we all pack less for our end-of-summer trips, there is a message for us as we consider our faith journeys.

Perhaps we want to add more of a sense of urgency as we work toward spreading the love of Christ in the world. Maybe we serve at church or in other ministries more frequently or with more excitement, or we tell friends and strangers about our faith with a renewed sense of passion. Why? Because we are sharing the BEST news ever – Jesus brings healing and love to all!

And secondly for us, whether we take stuff with us as we serve and share or whether we don't – maybe it's about the faith that we put into this work and into our journeys. Are we trusting that God is providing everything we need in our lives? Are we journeying with courageous vulnerability?

As we journey forth to love and serve our neighbors, our faith is essential. Though we may not be able to heal everything or fix other people's problems, we know that God will provide us with the right words to say, the healing moments of silence, the hugs of compassion, and the resources we need to show Christ's love to everyone we meet.

May God bless you upon your journeys, today and always, Pastor Christie

Much thanks to Judy Royse who sprays the plentiful weeds around our church grounds in this terribly hot weather to keep it looking well kept!



MOSES AND NOAH HAVING AN ARGUMENT

BEAUTIFUL FEET

"How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" (Romans 10:15, NIV). Such beauty has nothing to do with the feet being clean, newly pedicured, elegantly clad. They may be the dusty feet of aid workers bringing food to drought-stricken areas, or the muddy shoes of those rushing disaster relief to flood zones. They may be the swollen feet of a dedicated nurse after a 12-hour hospital shift, or the tired feet of a parent pacing with a baby at 3 a.m.



In the upper room before Jesus' arrest, he declared his disciples' dirty feet beautiful by touching and washing them lovingly, preparing them to go out yet again with his good news for all. And on

the cross, Jesus' own feet — nail-pierced — were beautiful.

After Pope Francis died on Easter Monday 2025, many mourners who paid their respects noticed his shoes. Instead of new, well-polished "dress shoes," the scuffed items clearly had walked countless steps. They were the sturdy boots of a worker, a pilgrim, a travel companion on the road of life, the journey of faith. They were the shoes — the feet — of a disciple of Christ willing to go wherever needed to bring the good news of God's love. How beautiful! — **Heidi Hyland Mann**

What you need:Clear plastic cup




- Battery tea lights

- 3. Turn on the tea light and place it inside the cup.
