**Tasks are available for all ages and all ability levels.**

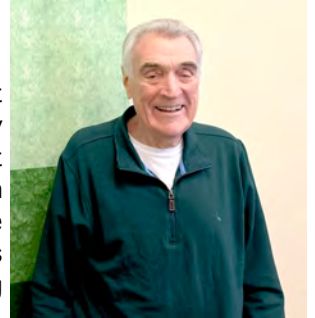

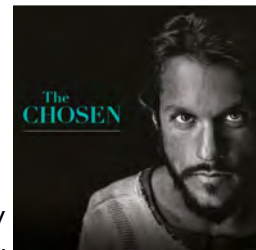
## BIBLE STUDY

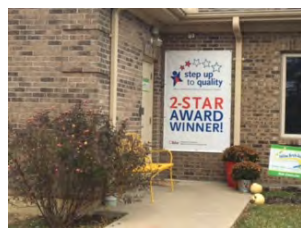
