Wiser Than His Years

Jake Byrne

It is uncommon for young people in Generation Z to choose to attend church on their own. Jake Byrne stands out from his peers in this regard. Unlike many others his age, Jake not only attends worship services every week but also actively participates by serving with the music ministry team.



Jake fondly recalls his earliest experiences at Hope Lutheran Church. These memories have shaped his commitment and involvement in the church community, setting him apart as a young person who is truly wiser than his years. The people, music, and his family all play an important role in drawing Jake to his church.

Jake discovered his passion for trains early in life. At around eight years old, he started chatting with **John Kroger and George Albright**, who were fellow train enthusiasts. Although he didn't immediately realize the value of these connections, they eventually grew into long-lasting friendships. Jake was delighted when George presented him with a train table and a cast iron steam engine; he cherished these gifts, feeling supported and understood by his friends.

While trains captured Jake's imagination, his love for music was also evident from a young age. His parents nurtured this interest by taking him to drum lessons when he was five years old. Their encouragement during these lessons gave Jake confidence and a sense of belonging. He told them his goal was to one day take **Mr. Mike's** place as the drum set player.



Today, Jake plays the guitar and drums for worship services. He also plays the tenor drums in the University of Cincinnati Marching Band.

Be Still & Know Contemplative Practices for Lent

Be still, and know that I am God!
– Psalm 46:10



Stillness can be challenging. I mean, it is pretty easy to sit on the couch – I am especially good at that! But, even if our bodies are still, it can be difficult to calm our minds and our spirits. Our minds are always racing. We're worrying about the future, or stressing over things that happened in the past. We're thinking ahead to all that we need to do or thinking about how we didn't get it done yesterday. We are also inundated by constant entertainment, messages, and noise from other sources.

There is a sense of peace that can come from simply being present with God, from just showing up, silencing the chatter in our brains, and truly listening. If we can trust ourselves to be still and know that God is taking care of everything for even a few minutes, our faith and confidence in God will grow.

We can of course “be still” when sitting in a chair (or on the couch!... or the floor or the ground outside). We can do this when lying down to go to sleep at night, or when lying in our beds as we wake up in the morning. Sometimes I find it easiest to silence my mind and connect with God when my body is moving. That can be through yoga, a walk in nature, or any other exercise that feels comfortable.

Throughout the season of Lent, here at Hope we are offering three contemplative practices to help us “Be still and know.”

1. **Evening Prayer** – Each Wednesday during Lent, join us at Hope at 7 p.m. for a beautiful sung worship service, entitled Holden Evening Prayer. Through the simple and repetitive melodies and harmonies, we find ourselves relaxing together into God's peace. It truly is a perfect way to find peace in the middle of our busy weeks.
2. **The Ignatian Workout for Lent** – Do not worry! This Lenten practice is not a physical workout, but a spiritual one. Through

spiritual exercises of St. Ignatius adapted by Tim Muldoon, we are reminded that the simplest of activities can be a way to deepen our faith and love one another. Even if you are unable to attend Thursday afternoon (1pm) Bible Study at Hope, I invite you to purchase this book or see me for handouts, and enjoy these daily meditations.



3. **Chair Yoga** – Thursdays at 9:30 a.m., this practice will be ongoing even beyond



Lent. I did want to highlight it here though because it is a perfect way to practice mental and spiritual stillness while our bodies are moving. Join us Thursdays if you

can. And if not, maybe think about ways that you can pray while your body is moving through walking, stretching, or other gentle exercise.

I hope that you are able to connect to God through one or more of these practices, or to find a practice of your own that fits into your life. Whatever makes the most sense for you, may you find stillness and may you rest in God each day throughout this Lenten journey.

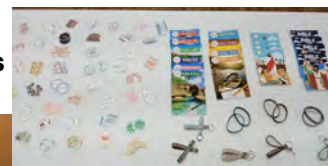

The butterfly reminds us of new life and the Resurrection. After three days, Jesus rose from the dead and brings us the hope of new beginnings. This simple craft helps children celebrate that joyful truth.

What you need:

- Light-colored construction paper
- Card stock
- Glue
- Paint
- Paintbrush
- Paper towel or baby wipe



What you do:

- Cut out a butterfly body from the construction paper.
- Glue the butterfly body onto the card stock.
- Use a paintbrush to coat the palm of one hand with paint.
- Press your painted hand beside the butterfly body to create a wing.
- Repeat with your other hand to make the second wing.
- Clean your hands with a paper towel or baby wipe.
- Optional: Add Luke 24:5-6 (NIV) around the butterfly or on its body:

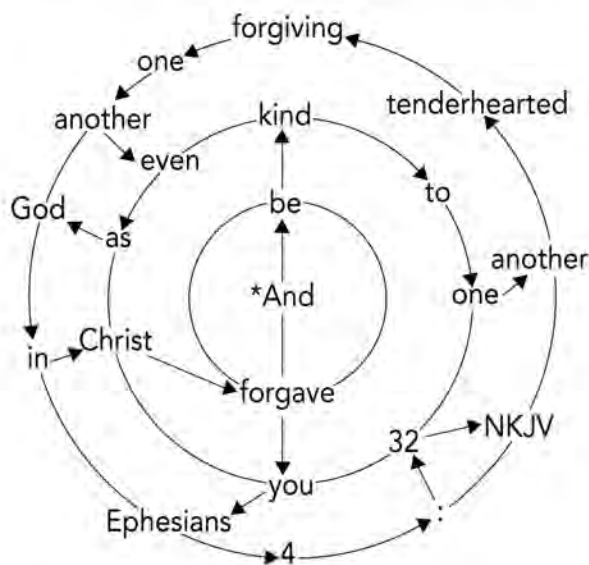
"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"
